- Half the year group will be going swimming on Wednesdays – please provide your child with a plastic carrier bag to put their wet clothes in.

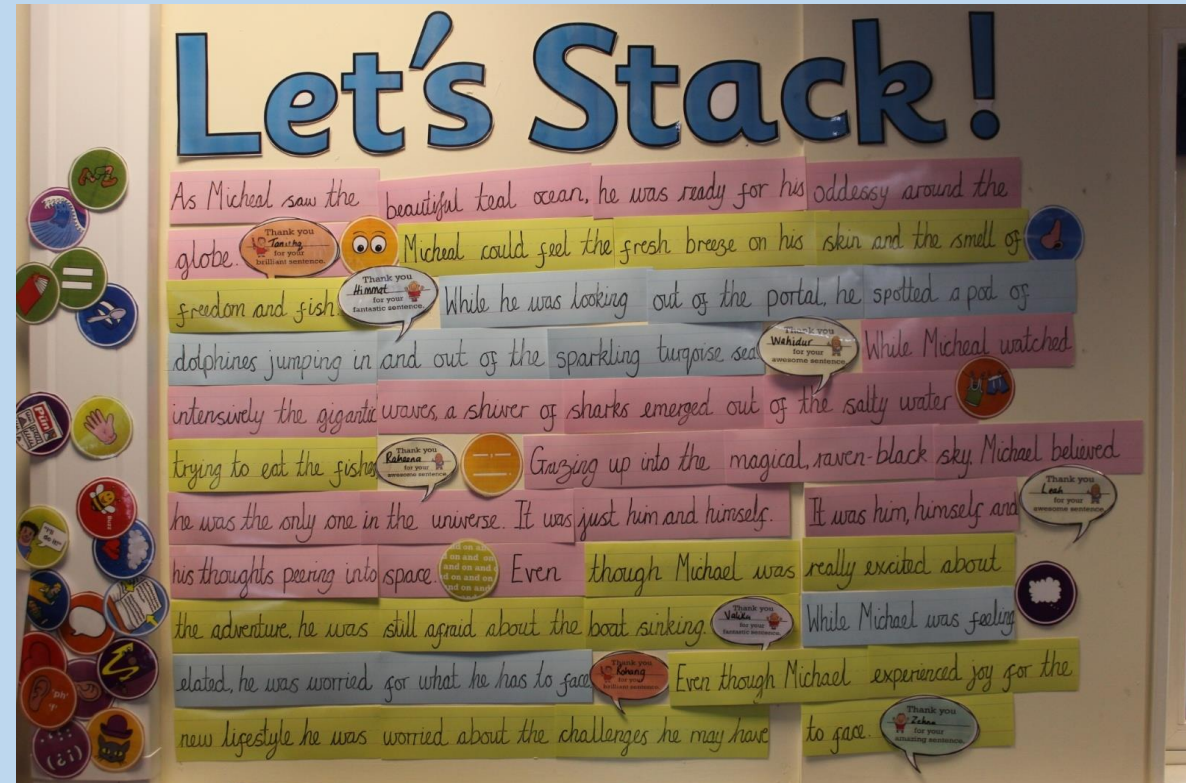
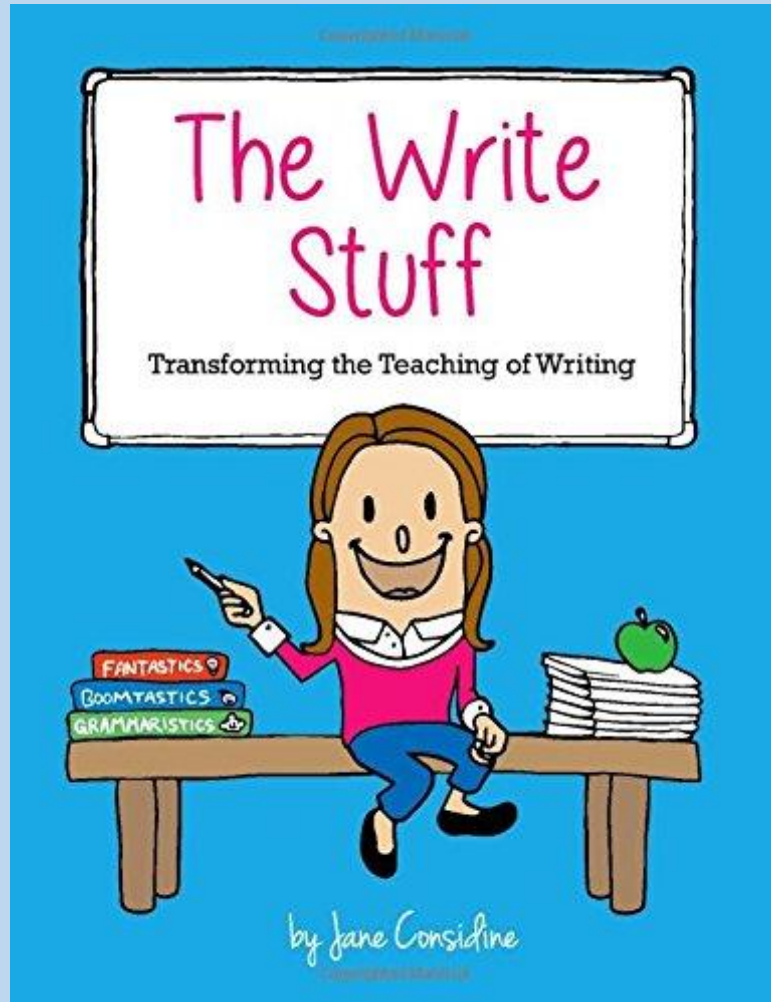


## Homework

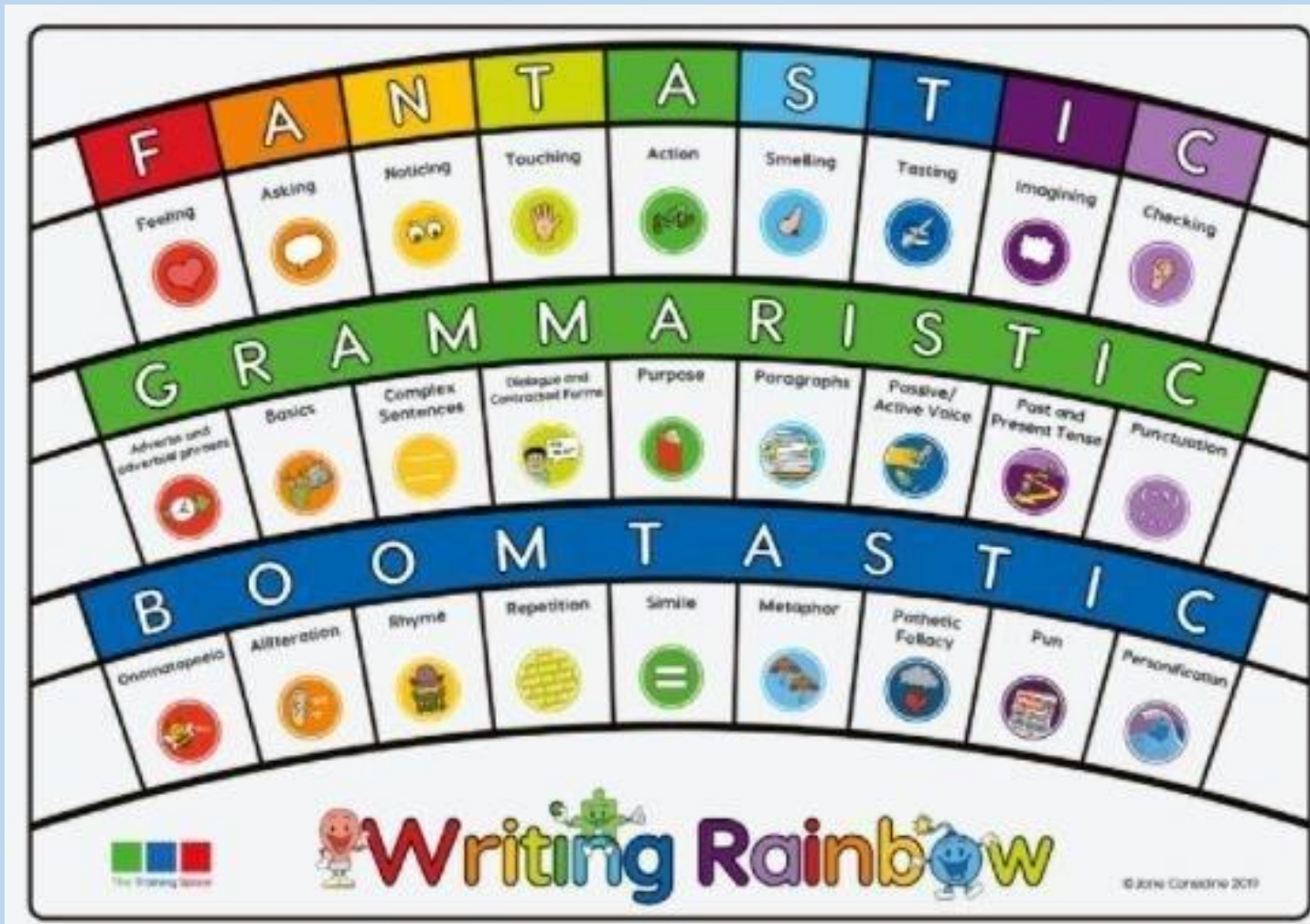
- Homework is sent on a Friday and should be completed by the following Friday.

# Where Should My Child Be?

## End of Autumn Term

At the end of the Autumn term, **33%** of the objectives in each subject should be achieved.

This will be recorded as **EMERGING** or **Y5E**.

This means your child is achieving **ARE**.

## End of Spring Term

At the end of the Spring term, **66%** of the objectives in each subject should be achieved.

This will be recorded as **DEVELOPING** or **Y5D**.

This means your child is achieving **ARE**.

## End of Summer Term

At the end of the Summer term, **100%** of the objectives in each subject should be achieved.

This will be recorded as **SECURE** or **Y5S**.

This means your child is achieving **ARE**.
