Passwords	A secret word or phrase that must be used to access certain things
Private	Something which must be kept to yourself, and not shared with anyone
Personal Information	Information that is related to you- Name, Address, Post Code, Where you go to school
True/False	Accurate or real information is True. Made up or wrong information is false
Internet	Accessed by a device such as iPad or Computer, the internet holds lots of information, games, videos and files, and allows communication



ZIP IT
Keep your personal stuff private and think about what you say and do online.

BLOCK IT
Block people who send nasty messages and don't open unknown links and attachments.

FLAG IT
Flag up with someone you trust if anything upsets you or if someone asks to meet you offline.

Stay Safe

Don't give out your personal information to people / places you don't know.

Don't Meet Up

Meeting someone you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous. Always check with an adult you trust.

A

Accepting Files

Accepting emails, files, pictures or texts from people you don't know can cause problems.

Reliable?

Check information before you believe it. Is the person or website telling the truth?



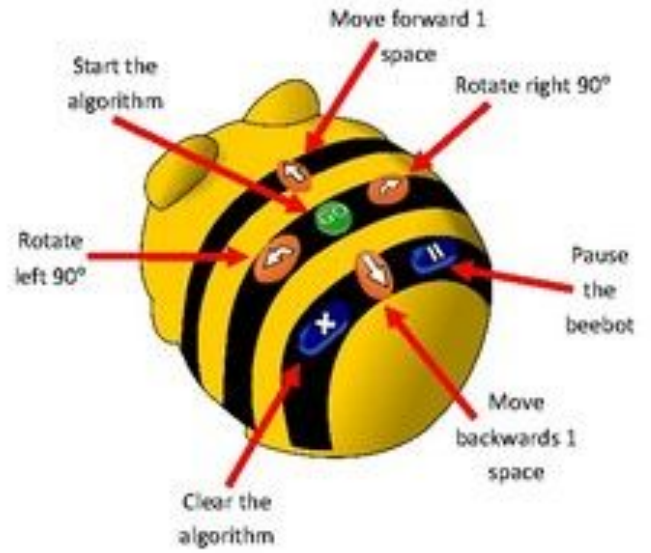

Tell Someone

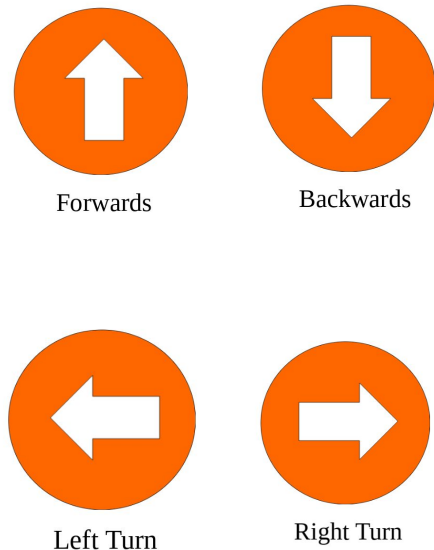
Tell an adult if someone or something makes you feel worried or uncomfortable.

Vocabulary	
Instructions	A detailed order or directions
Algorithm	A set of rules or instructions that can be followed to achieve something
Predict	To use your knowledge to say what you think will happen next
Debug	To fix errors in programs and algorithms
Execute	Run a program, press go, start the algorithm or instructions
Sequence	The steps that are followed in order

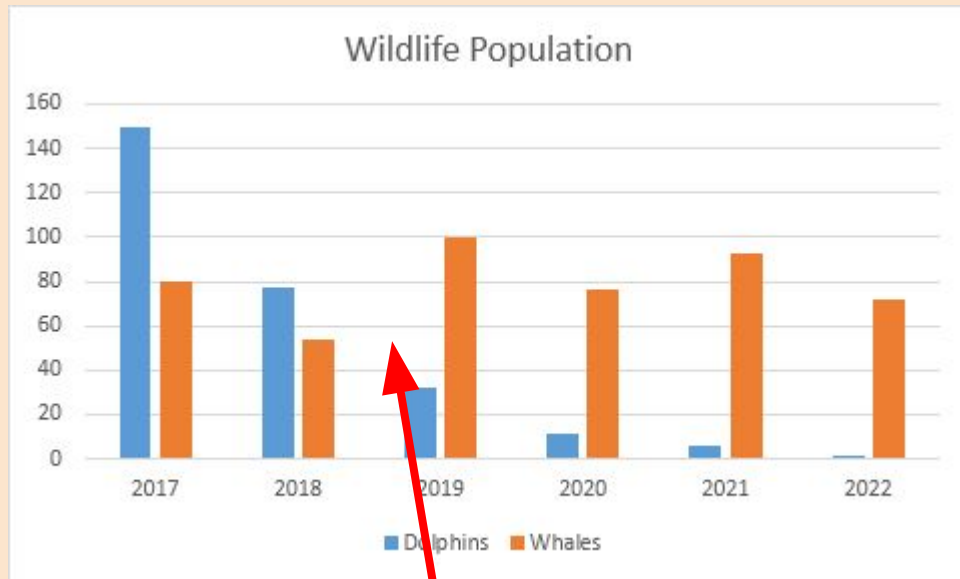

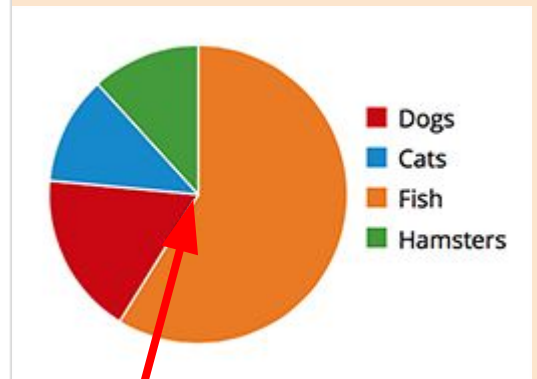

Branching Database	A way of grouping or sorting objects

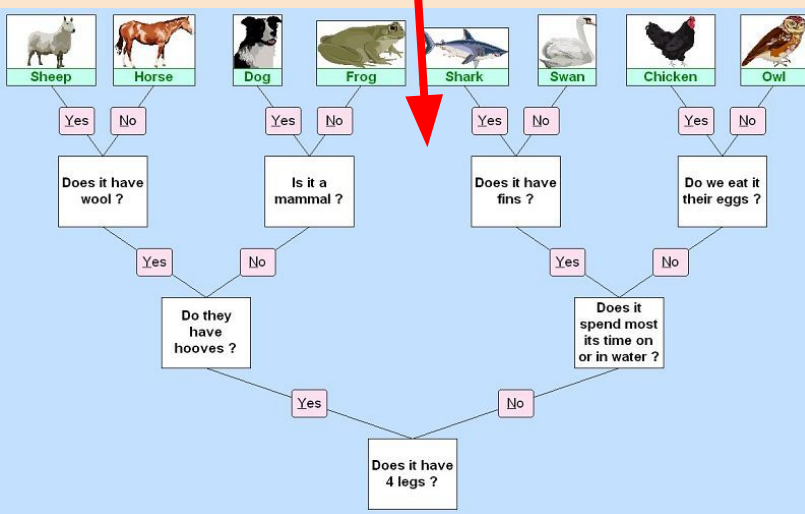


Bar chart

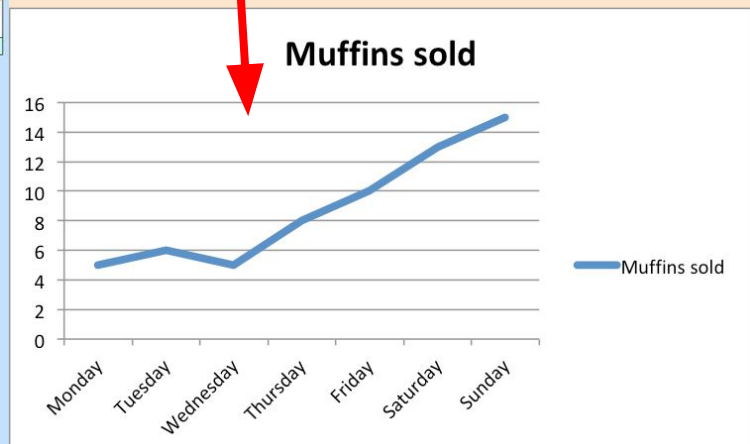


Pie chart

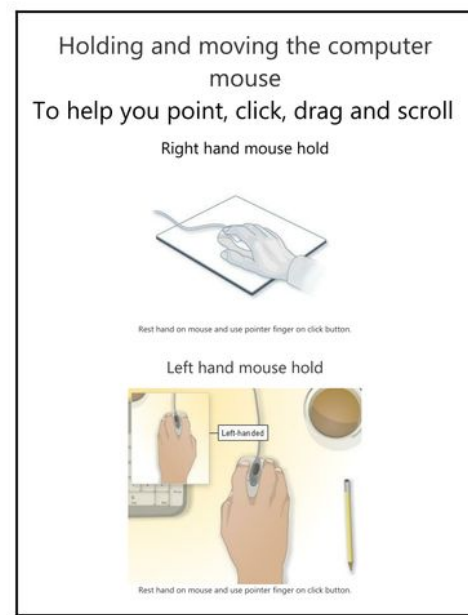
email	Electronic mail (or e-mail or email) is an Internet service that allows those people who have an e-mail address (accounts) to send and receive electronic letters. Those are much like postal letters, except that they are delivered much faster when sending over long distances, and are usually free.
online	Actions when connected to the internet.
inappropriate	Not suitable.
minimise	Hide the contents of the screen without removing it forever.
back buttons	Navigate back to a previous page.
send	The button to press to ensure the message gets to the person you want to send it to.
